Title of the Lesson Plan: The Power of Positive Solutions: "Read and Run"

50 minutes

C) Aims (Rationale)

Practice reading rapidly - develop reporting - stretch attention span - exercise learners' memories - enhance cooperative learning

D) Materials

Visuals - picture of a woman wearing a fur coat/ a leather bag/ shoes/ make-up

E) Presentation (Pre-Lesson Warm-Up, Instructions and Extended Activities) Pre-Lesson Warm-Up

Visuals displayed on the board; brainstorming question (referring to the animal pictures in the text); introducing some lexical items

Instructions

- 1. A's students ask questions to B's students, who run to the text part, scan for answers, and bring them back to their partners to be written down.
- 2. Switch roles and do the same thing again
- 3. Question samples:

A's: mention three endangered animal species

A's: What does your refer to?

B's: Pick out a detail showing people's support for wildlife

B's: The writer is pessimistic? Optimistic? Justify your answer.

Either: find words that mean "killing" and "danger"
