## E) Presentation (Pre-Lesson Warm-Up, Instructions and Extended Activities)

## **Pre-Lesson Warm-Up** (5 minutes)

Group work: pupils are asked to make up some questions they think the text might answer.

#### **Instructions** (15 minutes)

- 1. Pupils read the text and check their guess.
- 2. Reading for gist (multiple choice questions)
- 3. Scanning (inferential questions)
- 4. Emotional response of students (evaluative questions: opinion, feelings)

## Extended or Follow Up Activities (optional) (20 minutes)

Writing a paragraph about Rosa Parks / Does Rosa Parks remind you of a Tunisian hero? => Group work

Group A: Use the Internet and log onto websites recommended by the teacher to gather the information required to write a paragraph about that famous Tunisian hero.

Group B: Run to their friends to collect the information and provide Group C with it.

Group C: Read and select the appropriate information and write the paragraph. This activity should be done within the time limit set by the teacher.
